Contract Opportunity

Orienteering Canada is looking for one or more contractors to create content for 3 new resources. These documents will be launched in early April, 2017 and promoted in the lead-up to National Orienteering Week (May 20 - 28, 2017), World Orienteering Day (May 24, 2017) and ParticipACTION's day (May 24, 2017) when they will be specifically promoting orienteering as part of the [150 Play List](#) (150 physical activities to try in 2017)

Orienteering Canada has received funding from ParticipACTION for the creation of these resources.

Resource #1 - Creating a Map

A guide to help an individual create a map to be used for an orienteering event. This manual will explain using existing non-orienteering maps, google maps, google earth as well as using how to create basic orienteering maps using existing technologies.

Target audience: teachers, youth leaders, camp counselors, etc.

Resource #2 - Organizing an Orienteering Event

A guide to help an individual organize a simple orienteering race. The document will include information about relevant race formats (point-to-point), score-o, etc and will outline the process involved to organize a simple race.

Target audience: teachers, youth leaders, camp counselors, etc.

Resource #3 - Organizing an Orienteering Clinic

A guide to help an individual organize a "learn to orienteer" clinic targeted to beginners. The content in this resource will be based on the 3-step intro clinic resource which has been created by Foothills Orienteering and has been successfully used by several orienteering clubs (contact [us](#) for a link to this resource if desired).

Target audience: Primarily to orienteering clubs and also teachers, youth leaders, camp counselors, etc. (some modifications will be required if there is no access to an actual orienteering map)

Additional Resources

It is expected that the contractor(s) will also supply a list of useful links to related resources that may be added to the resources and/or the Orienteering Canada web site.

Document Layout

Depending on the skill set of the contractor(s), the layout of the resources may be done by the contractor or will be handled separately.

These resources will be translated into French. The timeline is to have the content of these documents completed by early March with the translation and layout to be completed by late March.

The goal is to create relatively short, yet useful resources with a professional look to assist beginners to try orienteering.

Remuneration: \$20/hour to an agreed upon maximum number of hours.
